How does Regis support international students?

We are here to help international students before, during, and after their time on campus. Our Admission and Student Affairs staff coordinates communication leading up to arrival and International Orientation. Throughout your years as a Regis student, a dedicated international student advisor assists with immigration matters and the transition to American culture and higher education. And, we provide support for international students seeking internships and employment opportunities, or going on to graduate school.

Will I need to bring a computer?

We provide all students with Apple iPad tablet computers for academic and personal use, and students keep their iPads after graduation. Many students also bring laptops or PCs for research and writing. Our wireless network extends across the campus.

Can I take classes at other nearby institutions?

Yes. Regis has cross-registration agreements with other outstanding schools in the area, including Boston College, Babson College and Bentley University.

Is Boston close by?

Regis is only 12 miles (20km) from Boston, America's most popular college town. Shuttle buses connect the campus to public transportation and easy access to the city center, Logan International Airport, or Amtrak.

Is housing available on campus?

Yes. Nearly all undergraduate students live on campus, and international students should plan to do so, too. Residence halls are professionally staffed, and building access is securely restricted.

Are meal plans offered?

Yes — 19 meals a week for residential students in the college's dining facilities, and flexible meal plans for commuter students. Hot entrees, salads, sandwiches and fresh fruit are offered daily.

What measures help ensure the health and safety of students?

Our Campus Police Department provides 24/7 coverage to promote a safe environment at all times. Our healthcare clinic maintains regular hours throughout the academic year, and pharmacies and major hospitals are just minutes from campus.

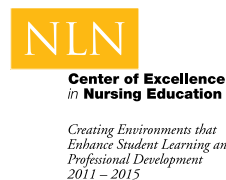
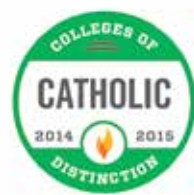


Nationally Recognized

At Regis College, we strive to create an academic and campus culture that supports a diverse community of students and professors from 21 countries around the world. On top of that, study-abroad programs, special coursework, and service opportunities take our students to five continents.

- Regis students can pursue studies at Regents University London, University College Cork in Ireland, Assumption College Rome, and Kyoto Notre Dame University in Japan.
- Students in a semester-long academic seminar on Church in the World traveled to the founding sites of the Sisters of St. Joseph in France, and to Switzerland, Italy and the Vatican City. Similar seminars have taken students to Kenya, Israel and China.
- An annual spring trip to a village in Peru engages Regis students in community service projects and brings a heightened understanding of the problems and conditions of poverty.
- A class trip to England brings students to theatrical productions in London and Stratford-Upon-Avon, led by a Regis professor of Fine Arts.

Career Focused

Throughout your years at Regis, you will participate in career workshops and work closely with faculty advisors and counselors to plan and pursue a path of study tailored to your interests and professional goals.

Through internships, service learning projects, undergraduate research, creative performance, clinical placements, summer programs and more, Regis students are engaged in a variety of active learning experiences that extend education beyond the classroom and into the real world.

Our relationships with companies and organizations in and around Boston provide a wide range of opportunities, and the College’s Center for Internships and Career Placement offers strong student support.

Application Deadlines

Fall (September) Admission:

- December 1 — Early Action, First-Year Candidates
- February 15 — Priority Date for Regular Decision, First-Year Candidates
- April 1 — Priority Date for Transfer Candidates

Spring (January) Admission:

- November 1 — All First-Year and Transfer Candidates

Applications received after the deadlines will be reviewed on a rolling, space-available basis.



Admission for International Students

To apply for admission, simply complete the following steps by the appropriate application deadline (see sidebar).

Application Form and Personal Statement: Apply online using the Common Application at www.commonapp.org. The application is free for international students who check the Regis College Fee Waiver box on the payment page.

Transcript (Academic Record): Submit an official secondary school transcript (in English) showing the courses and grades/marks received. National examinations, certificates, or diplomas (in English) may be submitted as well.

Standardized Tests/English Proficiency: If English is not your first language, you must submit results from one of the following tests: TOEFL, IELTS, CAE or PTE Academic. Submission of SAT or ACT test scores is optional, except for applicants to the Nursing program.

Recommendations: One letter of recommendation (in English) is required from a teacher of an academic subject.

International Transfer Students: Students may transfer to Regis from other colleges and universities by completing the Common Application and submitting the transcripts, test scores and recommendations described above. Transfer students must also submit an official transcript of their college-level coursework along with catalog course descriptions.

Students who completed college or university courses outside the U.S. must have their transcripts translated into English and credits evaluated by a recognized agency, listed on the webpage.

English Proficiency Tests

Regis is flexible when it comes to English tests. While we prefer scores above a 79 TOEFL, 6.5 IELTS, 58 CAE, and 58 PTE Academic, we will consider other English assessments and a range of results. We can offer international students academic support, a reduced course load, or conditional admission through an ESL partner.
